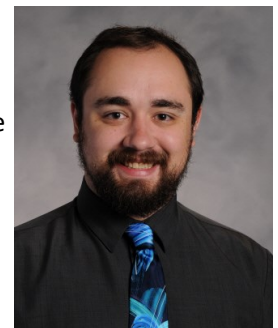

## Where Has the Time Gone?

It's hard to believe that it has only (or maybe already) been three months since my last letter to you all. So much has happened in those three months that it can be a little hard to keep track of it all. A building project that has been in the works for some time now, is taking shape before our eyes. My wife and I had the chance to take a somewhat belated honeymoon over Spring Break, and as soon as we got back we jumped straight into the marathon of Holy Week with its incredible swings from high to low and its many services to serve at. I have even, during the season of Easter, been able to create and preach my own sermon series for our Wednesday night services. It has been a busy few months and I wouldn't have traded a second of any of them.



I would like to pick up this month where we left off last time, at the beginning of three of the most formative years of my life. Typically, I would call this hyperbole, but in this instance I fully believe that the three years I spent at CUW, and especially the summers that followed, were instrumental in shaping me into the person that I am today.

Heading into my first year I had every plan to take things slow, maybe try out a couple of things while dedicating myself primarily to my coursework until I found a new groove. That however, was not to be, as I had a good friend already at Concordia who knew me well enough to know that if I didn't get brought into something right away, I would likely have never left my dorm room unless I had class. And so I "joined" the ministry team that she was in charge of.

Contrary to popular belief at the time I did in fact seek out interests of my own and found one that latched onto me and simply would not let go, the theater department. I initially popped by during their open auditions to inquire about working in the tech department, and I left that day with a less than optimistic, "We'll let you know a bit closer to time." About a month passed and I hadn't really heard anything so I put it out of my mind until I got an email from the department director, a wonderful lady named Lori, asking me to set up a brief interview with her and the tech director. At the time I had absolutely no idea what exactly I was getting myself into, but what I thought was me signing on for a single show turned into me serving as lead technician for everything we did over the next three years.

Serving under Lori was an experience unlike any other I had ever experienced. Techies in the department were not safe from the various warm up exercises or other activities planned for the actors, so I found myself "side to side, back to back, and face to face" with some of the most extroverted people I had ever known before in my life, for hours at a time.

Needless to say their attitudes started to rub off on me and I even ended up taking a couple of theater classes along the way. They became the family that I needed, even though I was their polar opposite in so many ways. The theatre broke down a number of my walls and opened me up to a whole host of new people and possibilities and I will be forever thankful to Lori and all those I met along the way.

For all I learned, in general and about myself, during my time at CUW it was during those summers that I learned the most. I spent each of my summers those three years working up in Door County, at a restaurant called Harbor Fish Market and Grille. Unlike the theater department, I had not gone looking for a restaurant job, in fact Harbor hadn't even been on my list of jobs I was considering applying for. It was my first time solo in Door County. I had spent most of my day interviewing at a couple of places and I was looking for somewhere to eat in the evening. I called my mom who had more experience with the area and I wound up at Harbor for dinner that evening. I got to chatting with the bartender/bar manager while I was eating and he must have seen some kind of potential in me so by the time the end of the night, I had interviewed with him, the dining room manager, and the owner and I left with an application in my hand. I completed and returned it the next day and we were working on setting a starting date by that evening.

The theater taught me about myself, but Harbor taught me about people. In both, I worked with an incredible cast of characters who formed a team that seemingly could accomplish anything they set their minds to. The difference between the two however, was that at CUW we all had more similarities than we had differences, at the restaurant though, I'm not sure many of us had any similarities beyond that we all worked at the same place. Add to that 8 to 15 hour shifts with each other day after day and we bonded faster and tighter than I had with people I've been friends with for years. At first it was strange to have suddenly gotten so close to people I had next to nothing in common with, but it gave me a chance to get to know them on a much deeper level without working through their outer layers first.

The Lord has been incredibly good to me when it comes to forming me into who he needed me to be. Through my time at CUW, I learned what it meant to be open to others, that there was nothing wrong with letting other people help you sand off your rougher edges. Through my time at Harbor, I learned that sometimes you don't need to have anything in common with someone for them to make an incredible impact in your life, or to make an incredible impact on theirs.

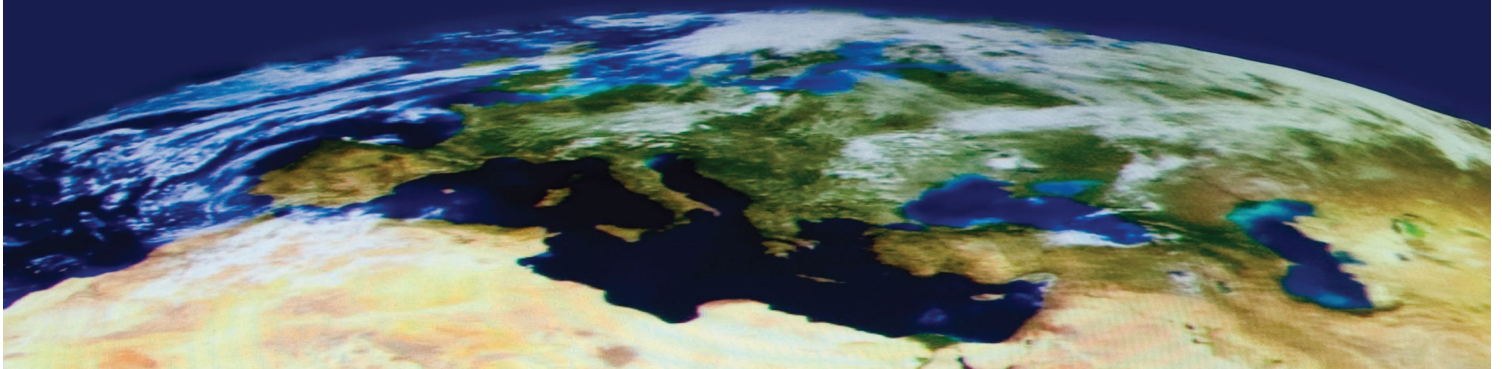

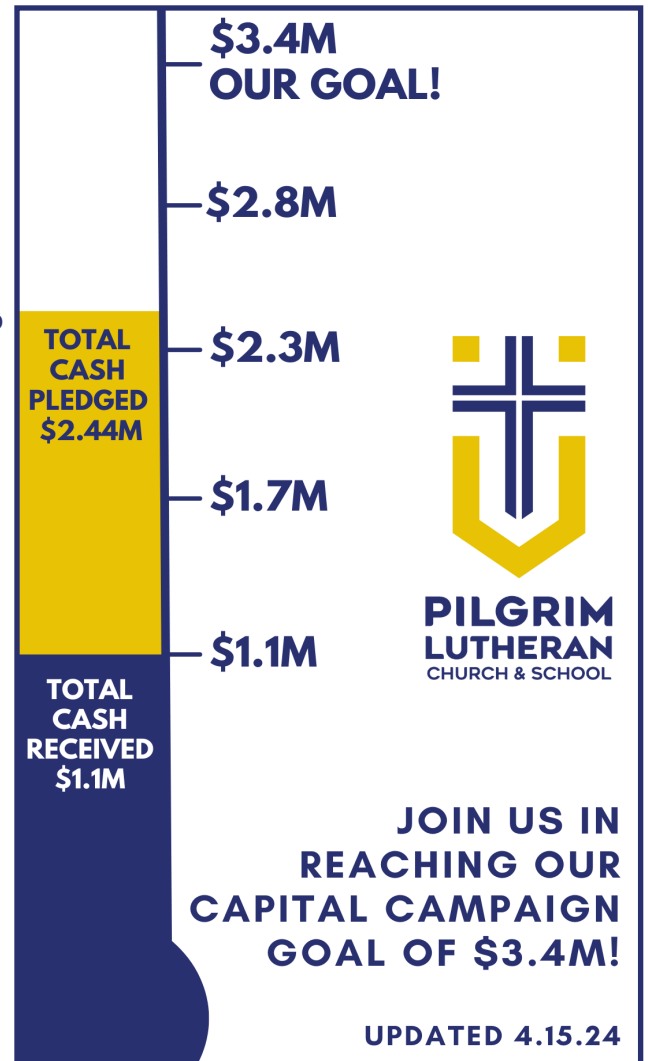
### A NOTE FROM PRINCIPAL SOMMERMEYER

If you have not gotten to know me yet, you may not know that I like to break things. I am not a status quo, kind of guy. So when I was asked to put together a statement for the Foundations Campaign I found myself staring at two big things Pilgrim has broken in the last several months.

First, we've broken the expectations of enrollment for 2024/25. We are currently projecting over 340 students next year, with over 100 choice students. That breaks our initial estimates of 325, helps us with the operating budget, and means even more families get to experience Pilgrim.

The other broken item is expectations around the capital campaign. When we initially sat down and projected the capital campaign we developed "worst case scenario" budgets based on \$1.5 million pledged/raised over the three-year campaign. To date, we have cash in hand of over \$1 million and pledges that bring us to over \$2.44 million! I really do like to break things...especially when God's blessings help us put them back together, better than before!

Today, I praise God for his blessings of even more kids to share Jesus with AND the support of the entire Pilgrim community for our Foundations Campaign! Let's keep breaking things together!

**BEING THANKFUL**

My husband, Larry and I had been married 29 years. Larry was healthy...until 5 years ago when a mass was found in his lungs that the doctors thought nothing to worry about and to watch it. He was finally diagnosed with Pulmonary Fibrosis. It's a disease where the body produces scar tissue in the lungs. You can't stop it, but there are drugs to slow that process down. Eventually you need a lung transplant.

I, along with family, friends, co-workers, and Pilgrim all prayed for the Lord to heal Larry. Larry got worse...it hurt to move (due to the lack of oxygen) and then Larry went to heaven, which led me to write about grief.

Today I want to talk about being thankful. How can I and others be thankful? The Lord took away my Larry and your loved one. Pastor reminded me that the Lord DID heal Larry, but not in the way I had in mind. He got the ultimate healing. Don't we pray in The Lord's Prayer THY will be done?

I know it can be difficult to think of thankfulness with grief. Grief never goes away but we learn how to incorporate that into our lives. Be thankful that the Lord gave that person, your loved one to you! Of all the people in the whole universe God gave you the spouse, parent, or child to have in your life to love.

An exercise that I challenge you to do is to list on a sheet of paper the letters A-Z. Each line gets a letter. Then beside the letter write what you are thankful for. For example: A-apples (corny, but I am thankful for a nice juicy apple). B-beauty, I am glad there are so many colorful things in the world. C-Cort, my son-in-law. D-Doug, my grandson....you get the picture. When you get to X...I used x-rays, I am thankful we have them. Doing this exercise will not only help you have a perspective on your life but it's a good thing to praise God for what He has blessed you with.

It is sometimes impossible to understand why you are left behind on Earth. You miss your loved one so much! The Lord has a reason. Maybe it is so that you can love others. Your family or fellow believers or friends. Maybe you can be a witness and show others how to live with grief. Maybe to be a volunteer. When you come up (if grief is so new and so raw) you can see the world a little different and find things to be thankful for. For the letter B it can be breath, which we take so much for granted.

I pray that through this exercise and taking time to think about what you have instead of what you've lost will be a comfort and blessing to you. You may want to from time to time do the list again and see what other things come to mind. I will share with you what I say every morning why I open my eyes, "This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it." (Psalm 118:24)

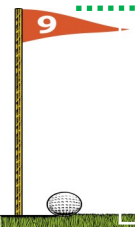

## THE BLESSING OF A NEW BABY

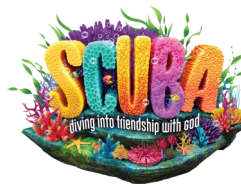
