A Coaching Theologian

We all know Vince Lombardi is a famous football coach, and you've likely heard or are familiar with a few of his famous quotes as a leader. If you're not a fan of football, don't stop reading yet, I promise, football is only a segue. One of Lombardi's famous quotes and habits may have caused you some head scratching if you've ever paid attention to the clock outside Lambeau Field. It's always set 15 minutes ahead of the actual time, as a nod to Lombardi's quote, "If you're not 15 minutes early, you're late."

The previous quote notwithstanding, Lombardi was also a good theologian. In fact, for quite a while he planned to become a priest in the Roman Catholic church. His theological studies stuck with him and I am convinced formed his approach to leadership and life. Consider this quote:

"God, your family, and the Green Bay Packers, in that order."

Part of a larger quote, this famous (and on the wall in my office) quote teaches us vocation quite well: God first, then our family, then whatever vocations (careers and so much more) God has called us to. Or consider this:

"Perfection is not attainable, but if we chase perfection we can catch excellence."

Life isn't about trying to become perfect, but by recognizing God has called us to be perfect, and has imparted Christ's perfection to us, we are able to live excellently, serving him and neighbor. Or finally, this quote:

"If you aren't fired with enthusiasm, you will be fired with enthusiasm."

Bringing enthusiasm to our daily work is often hard, but if we don't do so, we may find ourselves out of a job. But money is not why we work, or at least it shouldn't be. Consider this quote, from C.F.W. Walther, the first President of our Synod:

"A doctor will properly carry out his difficult duties only when he is motivated by love and a passion for his special work and is unconcerned about the filthy money that he may gain for his work. Even so, a theologian will be faithful in his calling only when he is filled with enthusiasm for it and finds his chief reward in the way God uses him to save souls, destroy the kingdom of Satan, build up the kingdom of God, and increase the number of those who are in heaven."

May God bless you to be faithful in all the vocations he has called you to: your work and other activities, but moreover your family, and above all your call as a Christian. By the way, if you show up 15 minutes early to church, you normally get your seat of choice, and some good time to meditate by yourself before the service begins.

Orphan Grain Train

Relief for Human Need Worldwide is provided by **Orphan Grain Train**, our "Coins for Christ" focus this month. Sharing resources and bringing Christ's name and character to needy people far and near, **Orphan Grain Train** is a Christian volunteer network that ships donated food, clothing, medical and other needed items to people in sixty-nine different countries, on five continents, including the United States. **Orphan Grain Train** has volunteers in twenty-nine regional locations across the United States who gather clothing and other relief supplies for destitute people around the world. They also raise money to send these relief goods and food where it was most needed.

The Wisconsin branch of **Orphan Grain Train** is located in **Westfield Wisconsin**. On the website, www.ogt.org, you will find a great deal of information – including about the **Wisconsin Branch** which has provided 12,326 pounds of various foods, school supplies and furnishings, Bibles, clothing and bedding to Manna from Heaven in **Myra, Kentucky**, this past June. In addition, Wisconsin Branch volunteers loaded school supplies, Bibles, medical equipment, diapers, hygiene supplies and other goods that were delivered to Latin American Lutheran Mission (LALM) in **Laredo, Texas**, this past June. The Social Charity Fund Compassion in **Kyrgyzstan** will soon be receiving medical equipment, bikes, sewing machines, blankets and clothing from the Wisconsin branch. And these are just a few examples of the amazing work done by OGT volunteers in Wisconsin.

What is Orphan Grain Train? OGT is a 501c3 Nonprofit Christian volunteer network that shares personal and material resources with needy people in America and around the world. Rev. Ray S. Wilke, current President and co-founder, explains, that while Lutheran Hour Ministers were in Riga, Latvia, in 1992, the idea of how to provide spiritual help and humanitarian aid to hungry souls and bodies resulted in the formation of the Orphan Grain Train.

Since 1992, more than 36 million fortified rice meals were shipped to those who were malnourished world wide and 3,973 shipments of humanitarian aid were sent to needy people. **Orphan Grain Train, based in Norfolk, Nebraska**, is a recognized service organization of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS). Many shipments have been in cooperation with Lutheran Hour Ministries, LCMS World Mission, LCMS World Relief, and other Christian Ministries. Your offerings of prayers and donations for this far-reaching mission serving destitute and needy people are deeply appreciated. Thank you.



LCMS - 175 Years

On April 26, 1847, 14 congregations sent representatives to the founding convention of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod (LCMS) in Chicago. How did it come about?

Pastor Fredrich Wyneken (1810-1876) arrived in the United States in 1838 from Germany. He noticed the need for a synod that would follow Biblical teaching and provide pastors for congregations. Pastor Wyneken along with several other pastors formed a preacher's seminary in Ft. Wayne, Indiana in October 1846.

Pastor C. F. W. Walther (1811-1887) became the leader of the Saxon Christians in Missouri. Pastor Walther started publishing a newspaper called "The Lutheran." When Pastor Wyneken received a copy of "The Lutheran," he reached out to Pastor Walther. In May 1846, Wyneken met with Walther and other Saxons to draft a constitution for a faithful, confessional Lutheran Church body. On April 26, 1847, 12 pastors and 14 congregations representing 3,500 to 4,000 members signed a revised version of the constitution. The German Evangelical-Lutheran Synod of Missouri, Ohio and other states was formally established.

8. St. Paul Lutheran Church, New Melle, MO
9. St. Peter Lutheran Church, Decatur, IN
10. Trinity Lutheran, St. Louis, MO
11. Zion Lutheran Church, Decatur, IN
12. Zion Lutheran Church, Willshire, OH

The Principal's Epistle

Start Your Children on the Way They Should Go

Proverbs 22:6 "Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it." (NIV)

This is the often quoted encouragement for parents at the beginning of the school year. Children can be rebellious and challenging and often, as a parent, we are tempted to throw our hands up in response and say, "I started them off, but do they have to resist so much!" The answer is sadly "YES". In all my years as teacher, principal and educational supervisor; I saw many great parents who were dedicated to raising their children in Christian love find them rebellious and difficult especially when they reached the pre-teen and teenage years. I even had parents come to my office seeking advice on what they should do. My response was the same. In most cases this is a necessary stage of child development. You worked with your child for 11 to 18 years to become a responsible adults. As part of that process children must reach a point where they need to become independent. That is not easy for them or for you as the parent who loves them. I am not saying that you should stop trying to correct your children, just that you stop beating yourself up for having a normal child who is struggling with becoming an adult. What your child does not realize is that they need you to provide that safety net for the challenges they face in this most important transition. Continue to pray and support them when they make good choices and help them when they need help making those choices.




