I recently conducted the funeral for Pilgrim member Ginger Lutz. The message mentioned her plans to head “home” from the assisted care facility where she was living. Little did we realize at the time that she would be heading “home,” but she would actually be heading home to heaven. She had one plan, but God had a different plan. We can all understand how that happens.

The Bible speaks about plans quite often. The best known verse about plans is probably Jeremiah 29:11, “I know the plans I have for you,” declares the Lord. “plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.” Scripture also tells us, “Many are the plans in a man’s heart, but it is the Lord’s purpose that prevails.” (Prov. 19:21)

Considering the remembrance of our nation’s Independence Day, we can look back in time and easily note that many different nations had plans for the land and nation we now call the United States of America. Spain had plans. France had plans. Mexico had plans, and England had plans. But many of those plans never came to fulfillment. Planning calls for careful scrutiny and great flexibility, and that can be a difficult combination.



What plans does God have for your home that are clearly offered in the Scriptures? How does your home reflect those plans, and how can you align your home-life more closely with HIS plans?

That’s the first step we took at Pilgrim. Before we polled the church, we studied the Scriptures, and we asked an important question, “What are the God-given obligations for every congregation according to the Bible?” We will always seek to match our planning with the Lord’s commanding.

Plans sure do change. Don’t they! For example, Ginger’s plans changed bit time! May the Lord give us wisdom to plan wisely, but to live with Spirit inspired flexibility to adapt to His leading and serve His Kingdom.

New Testament

On September 21, 1522, Luther's Translation of the New Testament into the common German language was published. The story behind the 500 year anniversary of the German language New Testament is as follows:

On January 3, 1521, Luther was summoned to appear before The Imperial Diet of Worms, Germany on April 17 and 18 to defend his writings before Charles V. On a long Latin speech, Luther built his case on the Bible. Luther was asked to recant his writings, but would not retract anything, because it is not safe to go against conscience.

In German he added: "God help me, Amen." Charles V issued the Edict of Worms where Luther had the status of an outlaw.

Elector Frederick the Wise arranged for Luther to stay at the Wartburg Castle near Eisenach from May 4, 1521 to March 1, 1522. While at the Wartburg, Luther was known as "Knight George."

Luther translated the New Testament from the end of December 1521 to the end of February 1522. The manuscript was edited by Philipp Melanchthon in Wittenberg. The New Testament was sent to Lotter's Printing Shop. The New Testament became a best seller at the autumn fair in Leipzig. During his stay at the Wartburg, Luther wrote 13 Treatises on "On Confession," "On the Monk's Vow," and 11 other topics.

Lutheran Bible Translators continues to translate the Bible into the languages of people groups around the world.


Derricks Family Sending Service

We thank you for your continued support of our mission efforts!



Lutheran Braille Workers

LOVE WORKS! The Mission of **Lutheran Braille Workers (LBW)** is that all people in the world who are Blind or Visually Impaired will have free access to the Good News of Jesus Christ as Savior, and every Bible is delivered free of charge to serve recipients world wide. **Lutheran Braille Workers**, our "Coins for Christ" recipient this month, is committed to helping men, women, and children who are Blind or Visually impaired know the love of Christ for themselves. From a recipient in Texas, "Do you know what you gave me when I was able to read the Bible for the first time in two years? You gave me hope again." If you, or a loved one, is Blind or Visually impaired and would like any of the LBW Christian materials for free, please call headquarters at 1-800-925-6092, or e-mail at lbw@lbwloveworks.org.

Lutheran Braille Workers started in 1943 in response to a shortage of Braille Bibles for Blind pastors in Germany. Mrs. Helene Koehler, with the support of her family, first learned Braille, and then began the process of transcribing the Bible into German Braille, one dot at a time, moving backwards across the page. Over 75 years later, **Lutheran Braille Workers** is the world's largest non-profit producer of Braille, Specialized Large Print, and Audio Christian materials. Millions have been reached with the Gospel message. LBW has shipped over 14 million volumes and millions of other pamphlets and materials in almost 40 languages, to 164 countries! From a prison chaplain, "Lutheran Braille Workers is the only organization that we have contact with that has been willing to provide us with a Bible for those who are truly visually disabled."

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) has been an ally of Lutheran Braille Workers for 78 years, and can be directly connected to the production and distribution of over one million volumes of Braille, Large Print, and Audio throughout the world. The Buy-A-Dot campaign begun in 2020, has allowed the purchase of a new PUMA Plate Embossing Device. Considering each Braille Bible contains over 3,000 plates, this new technology is important for the LBW ministry. From Philadelphia, "Thank you for helping my 10-year-old daughter feel like she belongs. She received her first free Braille Bible volume and was able to participate in Sunday School. She came home from church so filled with happiness."

Lutheran Braille Workers provides materials to recipients through 170 Ministry Centers in 32 States and around the World. In Wisconsin, Ministry Outreach centers are identified at Trinity Lutheran Church in Wausau and here at Pilgrim Lutheran Church. Donors, volunteers and supporters have access to LBW videos, logos, and other materials, some of which are for use in Sunday or church schools. Newsletters and other communications are available for download free at LBW website, www.LBWloveworks.org. A number of Braille files are downloadable to computers or Braille readers. **Lutheran Braille Workers Mission** is committed to sharing the Gospel with all 253 million people in the world who are Blind or Visually Impaired in a format and language they can understand and access. Thank you for your prayers and support to share this vital ministry. "We live by faith, not by sight – LOVE WORKS."


