We're Rich!

In 1949, Jack Wurm was broke and out of a job. One day he was walking along a San Francisco beach when he came across a bottle with a piece of paper in it. As he read the note, he realized that he was reading the will of Daisy Singer Alexander, heir to the Singer sewing machine fortune. The note read, "To avoid confusion, I leave my entire estate to the lucky person who finds this bottle, and to my attorney, Barry Cohen, share and share alike." The search was on. Was this for real? They checked. Yes, there was a Barry Cohen. Yes, he was Daisy's attorney. And the will?

A "frantic search" for the will ensued. The story of the hunt for the missing will is almost more dramatic than the message in a bottle. A mine detector was used to scan the walls of Alexander's mansion. A search was offered for Alexander's pet parrot, who Cohen thought might be able to lead him to the will. A clairvoyant was hired, who "dipped his hands in water, in order to 'magnify the electrical vibrations.'" Did this produce anything? Nope. So, what happened?

Cohen did respond to Wurm and examined a copy of the will. He told reporters that Daisy did have "a curious interest in floating communications around in a bottle," but also noted that it didn't mean Wurm could inherit the money. The true origin of the will was never discovered. Alexander's estate was finally distributed to her niece and nephew, and Wurm left California and retired in Minnesota, not rich. What does the life of Jack Wurm teach us about riches?

Jesus spoke about treasures. He said things like this. "The *kingdom of heaven* is like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up. Then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field." (Matthew 13:44). Solomon said, "My son, keep my words and treasure up my commandments with you ." (Proverbs 7:1) Jesus also said, "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, ²⁰ but lay up for yourselves *treasures in heaven*, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:19-21)

Jack Wurm's life can remind us that true treasure isn't found in a bottle by a one in a million chance encounter like winning the lottery. It's readily available to everyone! The treasure of the Gospel is ours and always available in God's Word! Let's rejoice like we just won the lottery and celebrate how rich we are in Christ our Lord, and let's share the wealth as well.



What's Happening

John Schultz's 45 Years in Ministry

There's no way to completely share the ministry of John, but here are some highlights. In November of 1976, John graduated from Concordia College - St. Paul, MN with a degree in Elementary Education and a secondary degree in Physical Education and English.


He and his wife, Ruth, were assigned a call to St. Paul's Lutheran School in Janesville, WI. While there for seventeen years he taught 5th grade, coached, served as vice principal (just to name a few), and earned his first Masters in Education. In 1992-93, John was proud to serve on the committee that went to Washington D.C. to receive the prestigious U.S. Department of Education's Blue Ribbon Schools Award for St. Paul's.

In 1994, after prayerfully considering three calls for his first principalship the Lord led him to be a principal/part time teacher at St. John's Lutheran School in Adrian, MI for three years. While serving there, he also assisted the school and church with many vacancy positions.

After Adrian, he accepted a call as principal to Evansville Lutheran School Association in Indiana. In 2005, he graduated with a masters in Administration aiding ELS to receive state certification for the first time. In those nine years he served the District in many ways including serving as a board member of the Indiana Non Public Education Assoc. (INPEA) that was looking into starting a statewide School Choice program.

In 2006, he accepted the call to serve Trinity Lutheran in Crown Point, IN. He helped them regain their state accreditation status. The efforts of the INPEA Board to bring a statewide School Choice program came to fruition and he implemented it at Trinity.

In 2015, he accepted the call to serve here at Pilgrim. As in the past, his prayers were answered with an increase of almost 100 students and the School Choice program grew from a handful of students to around 70 for the next school year. To God be the Glory for his years of service!



400 Kids and Counting

Last month "Sleep in Heavenly Peace" (SHP) completed their 400th bed delivery since it started the local chapter in February of 2021. What's more amazing to me is that "Sleep in Heavenly Peace" has delivered over 87,500 beds for kids since it was started in 2012! That's 6,000 more people than the capacity of Lambeau Field. "Sleep in Heavenly Peace" continues to grow and now has over 300 chapters in four countries.


The local chapter has a public build scheduled for May 7th and are planning to build 100 beds. Reach out to me for more information if you are interested in building beds for kids.

This new series entitled, “Rediscover Church,” will help you respond to several reasons for disconnecting, “I worship God on my own,” “I don’t believe in organized religion,” “Churches are filled with hypocrites,” or “I’ve been away too long and I don’t feel welcome.” Communion will be offered each week, and a free book will be offered to each worshiper as a study guide to God’s Word about drawing all people to reconnect with the Lord and His people.

POBLO International Ministries

POBLO (People of the Book Lutheran Outreach) is the focus of our “Coins for Christ” Mission this month. **POBLO** works in partnership with a number of charities to give assistance through International Friendship Centers to refugee families being resettled in Michigan, Missouri, Minnesota, Nebraska, Texas and Wisconsin. In addition, **POBLO** provides mission outreach in other states, now focusing on California (where half of the children have at least one immigrant parent), Iowa, Kansas, Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois. “The Mission Field is here – The time is NOW!” **POBLO** Ministries is one of the few missions which deploys missionaries across America who go out to share the good news of Jesus on a daily basis.

International Friendship Centers are at the core of **POBLO**’s outreach. (Two IFC’s are located in the Milwaukee area.) To bridge the gap between Americans and Muslims, and other immigrants and refugees who come to the United States for a better life, **POBLO** missionaries and volunteers reach out in friendship to build relationships. Support is provided to refugees and immigrants through **Resettlement Assistance**– including housing, finding employment, transportation, enrolling children in school and other basic necessities. **POBLO** helps immigrants and refugees adjust to life in a new country through **Cultural and Social Assimilation** - especially regarding laws, language, food and other aspects of life in the U.S. through classes and one-on-one meetings. **POBLO** volunteers and missionaries provide assistance through **distribution of food, clothing and furniture**, and offer **classes in English, citizenship and sewing**.

Many individuals who convert to Christianity from Muslim, Hindu, or Sikh backgrounds face persecution. **POBLO** provides **counseling** to these converts, as well as financial assistance and other physical, emotional and spiritual help. **POBLO** missionaries and volunteers provide **friendship and hospitality**, which are powerful expressions of God’s love, and help new arrivals feel truly welcomed.

POBLO International has taken the **Jesus Film Project** as a vital mission project. The vision is that over the next two years the Jesus film DVD will be placed in 200,000 non-Christian homes. Statistics say that when a Jesus DVD is placed in a single household, within two years it will be viewed by up to 50 people. This means that 200,000 DVDs would touch the lives of around five million people with the result that many would come to faith in Jesus. **POBLO** is a non-profit, Christian organization that is passionate about sharing the love of Jesus with Muslims and other immigrants and refugees living in the United States. 

Congratulations Boys Basketball Team
