Work in Progress

"If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him." (Luke 17:3)

The sign on the back of the truck was new to me, and I chuckled as I was driving home from work and passed it:

WET
YELLOW
PAINT

DO NOT
DRIVE
ON IT

They were repainting the yellow lane dividers on Hazelwood Dr., and apparently didn't want anyone to drive on the yellow paint. I noticed that the white paint was also fresh, or at the very least had recently been repainted, but there was no such warning against driving on it. I wonder if it's because the yellow paint was painted after, or costs more, or dries slower, or those dividers matter more, or if there was some other reason it was important not to drive on the yellow paint.

Road construction never seems to be convenient nor to fix the roads that matter most to us. As evidence of this I present to you a recent discussion among the church council: "It seems like only a matter of time until they repair St. Agnes Drive north of church. Are we ready for whatever challenges that presents?" An email to the City Council returned this response: "Based on our scale St. Agnes is several years away from reconstruction." Of course, it'd be easy to respond, "But you practically need a 4x4 to navigate the road!" but other roads in Green Bay must be much, much worse. God bless those who pave new roads, especially with clement weather to do so!

Life is a work in progress as well, isn't it? Sometimes we think a new coat of paint will hide our blemishes, but really we need God to do a full scale repair. And thanks be to God that, in Christ, he has done just that for you and me. God bless us to hear his word, repent of our sin, and follow where he leads!

Pilgrim likewise is a work in progress. Getting the new technology working took a while, but now it is working! About 17 years ago Pilgrim undertook a renovation, and now it is paid off! At one point there was no Pilgrim presence in Suamico, today there is! As we look forward in preparation for the challenges the next years will bring us, there are reasons for great hope: the school is growing and demand is greater than our current capacity. But there are reasons that are halting: a new trend report says Christianity will not be the majority within a few decades. As much as we may desire to drive where we each want, it is much better when we follow Christ. Do not drive on yellow paint, take up your cross and follow him!


"Well done good and faithful servant..." Matthew 25:21a

On June 24, 2022, the U.S. Supreme Court in a 6-3 ruling, said that the Constitution does not confer a right to an abortion. Now the voters of Wisconsin will determine if Wisconsin will determine if Wisconsin remains an abortion free state.

On Tuesday, November 8, we will have an opportunity to vote for our governor, attorney general, U.S. Senator, and member of the House of Representatives and various state and local officials.

ProLife: Does the candidate support that the life of a child begins at conception? What is their position on embryonic stem cell research and end of life issues?

Traditional Marriage: Does the candidate support the Biblical view of marriage between a man and a woman?

Religious Freedom: What is the position of the candidate on businesses providing creative services to same-sex couples and persons changing their sex and gender identity?

To help you determine which candidates are supported by Planned Parenthood (a major abortion provider) and the LGBT groups, a nonpartisan website provides information on who supports each candidate. Go to info@ivoterguide.com for more information. Think about it, our vote now supports a candidate that either supports life or abortion. Be sure to register to vote and cast an informed ballot on Tuesday, November 8, 2022.



The Principal's Epistle

Boy's Town Skills and Advice:

I have often read the articles from the Boy's Town help for parents. Much of what they suggest is documented ideas and suggestions for helping your child in school and later in life. Here is their What teachers wish parents would do at home.

So, what do teachers wish parents would do to help encourage children's learning? Here are a few suggestions:

•**Carve out a quiet time to talk about school and work on homework.** This is a big one. Love it or loathe it, homework is a major part of the curriculum. Children need to not only complete homework on time but also fully understand it. That means parents must make kids sit down and do it. Extracurricular activities, such as athletics and the arts, should always take a back seat to homework.

•**Remove distractions.** This goes hand-in-hand with the previous point. Children need to concentrate in order to complete their homework. Distractions such as television, smartphones and other electronic devices inevitably get in the way. The kitchen table is often a good place to sit down and do homework. Plus, it's often within sight of other rooms where Mom and Dad are likely to be, so they can keep an eye on the kids and make sure they're doing what they're supposed to be doing.

•**Support your kids' teachers.** This seems like a no-brainer, but it still needs to be said. If your child's teacher asks you to provide something for a project, please try to do so. If he/she asks you to help with your child's homework for a particular subject, help as much as you can. Working as a partner with teachers will only help improve your children's chances for success.

If you have an issue or question, schedule a meeting. Sometimes parents may have a question or problem with an assignment or other issue relating to their child's education. Rather than trying to deal with it via email or over the phone, it's a good idea to schedule a one-on-one meeting with the teacher to discuss it. In this case, it's best to leave the child at home so you and his/her teacher can have a frank and open discussion about the issue to resolve it.
